The NBEUB Marks 110 Years of Regulating in the Province

The New Brunswick Energy and Utilities Board is celebrating 110 years of regulation in the Province of New Brunswick. This milestone makes the New Brunswick Energy and Utilities Board the second oldest Board in Canada.

The Board is an independent quasi-judicial board charged with regulating public utilities. The Board was established in 1910 as the Board of Commissioners of Public Utilities. In the course of the last 110 years, the Board has regulated a number of public utilities in sectors such as electricity, natural gas, petroleum products, pipeline and motor carrier. Historically, the Board has also regulated other industries such as insurance, telephone, trucking, water, street railway, and payday loans.

The Board is comprised of 5 full-time Board Members, including a Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson. The Board also consists of 19 staff to assist in the processing, analysis, and management of regulatory filings, and inspections related to pipelines and petroleum product.
