O R D E R

WHEREAS by Notice of Motion filed in the within matter dated March 4, 2025, NB Power sought a declaratory Order from the Board with respect to the Board’s jurisdiction to determine routing or location of a capital project for which NB Power seeks approval under section 107 of the *Electricity Act* and that certain properties identified by intervener, Galbraith Equipment Co. Ltd were not impacted by its proposed Saint John Corridor Reinforcement Project (the “NBP Motion”);

AND WHEREAS Galbraith Equipment filed a Response in opposition to the NBP motion on March 7, 2025;

AND WHEREAS at the outset of the hearing of the NBP Motion, Counsel for Galbraith Equipment advised that it was no longer taking the position that the Board had jurisdiction to determine the routing of NB Power transmission lines;

AND WHEREAS as a result of this change in Galbraith Equipment’s position, NB Power requested that the NBP Motion be adjourned until the close of the evidentiary portion of the hearing of the within application at which time it would be deemed to be dismissed if not otherwise heard or determined in the interim;


AND WHEREAS no other party hereto objected to NB Power’s adjournment request;

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

The NBP Motion is adjourned and, unless ordered otherwise in the interim, is deemed to be dismissed at the conclusion of the evidentiary portion of the hearing of the within application, without prejudice to any party to bring the same or similar issues before the Board in the future.
