

New Brunswick Energy and Utilities Board Full-time Board Member

The New Brunswick Energy and Utilities Board (NBEUB) is an independent, quasijudicial tribunal, which regulates the industries and utilities under its jurisdiction.

The NBEUB provides regulatory oversight of the transmission and distribution of electricity, natural gas, pipelines, and the motor coach industry and also administers the weekly price regulation of petroleum products such as gasoline, diesel, and furnace oil. In addition to the above, the Board also performs adjudicative functions of the regulated sectors under the *Financial and Consumer Services Commission Act* and the *Mining Act* as of June 2023.

The New Brunswick Energy and Utilities Board, made up of five members, along with the staff provides oversight of these sectors to ensure fairness, transparency, openness, and independence. **NBEUB is currently seeking two full-time members to join the Board.**

For each role, the ideal candidate will bring a professional designation and background in finance, accounting, engineering, business, economics, law or other related field, along with strong analytical skills. A commitment to serving on behalf of public interest is required and senior experience in public law, regulation and adjudication would be considered an asset. As a self-directed individual, you will have experience working collaboratively with colleagues and possess excellent communication skills with the ability to digest and present complex matters in a clear and concise manner. Bilingualism in the Province's official languages is considered an asset.

Appointments are for a ten-year term with provisions for reappointment.
